## 5 great reasons to practice in Caledon

### 1 | Financial compensation

Designated as “underserved with support” by the Ministry of Health & Long Term Care. New physicians are eligible for the “Free Tuition Program” providing up to \$40,000 and the \$15,000 incentive grant over 4 years.

### 2 | Full-service access

Caledon is close to state-of-the-art facilities such as the new Brampton Civic Hospital (part of the William Osler Campus), Headwaters Health Care Centre in Orangeville, and the new Caledon Hospice. Referral contacts for tertiary care are maintained with hospitals throughout the Greater Toronto Area – all easily accessible from Caledon.

### 3 | Opportunity for growth

In addition to being full-time family physicians, many doctors in the area are involved in other aspects of healthcare. There are plenty of opportunities in the local healthcare system, and with some creativity and persistence, you can be sure to find your own niche.

### 4 | Access to computerized office environments

Presently, Caledon physicians and clinic owners are actively recruiting new doctors to cultivate a group practice. Many clinics have gone paperless.

## hospitals

Caledon is located close to major regional medical facilities in Orangeville, Brampton, Mississauga and Toronto – all less than a one-hour drive from Caledon. Headwaters Health Care Centre (Orangeville) has 108-beds, offering obstetrical, surgical, pediatric and critical care services. William Osler Health Centre operates two campuses: Etobicoke General and Brampton Civic Hospital. The modern new facility has 608 beds and can accommodate 90,000 emergency patient visits, 160,000 ambulatory care visits and 110,000 outpatient visits annually.

Caledon has an established hospice, made possible through the generous donations by local citizens, community organizations and businesses.

Caledon is located in the Greater Toronto Area, close to major provincial highways (400, 407, 410, 427 and QEW), regional roads (Highways 9, 10 and 50) and only 30 minutes northwest of Toronto Pearson International Airport.
