## Air

The Greater Toronto Airport Authority operates Toronto Pearson International Airport (YYZ), as a leading international gateway. Located only 30 minutes south of Caledon – and directly accessed via Highway 427 – it is Canada's largest and busiest international airport, moving 29.9 million passengers. Full cargo service is available to 165 North American and international destinations. Over 76 passenger airlines operate out of three terminals, providing passengers with same plane service to 26 Canadian, 44 American, and 44 international cities.
