Whereas the acceptance of the Precautionary Principle has become widespread; and

Whereas the Precautionary Principle is presently referenced in the following Ontario legislation: Endangered Species Act 2007, Health Promotion and Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, the Lake Simcoe Protection Act, 2008 and the Ontario Water Resources Act, R.S.O. 1990;

Therefore be it resolved that the Town of Caledon include in its comments to the Provincial Policy Statement Review that the Precautionary Principle should seamlessly be incorporated into all aspects of the Provincial Policy Statement where applicable;

Further Be it Resolved that a copy of this resolution be included in the Town comments on the PPS review and copies be sent to Sylvia Jones MPP, David Tilson MP, The Region of Peel, the CVC, the TRCA, and the NEC.

9.5 Council Inquiries:

(i) Councillor Whitehead indicated the parking lot at the Palgrave Community Centre is no longer full access for school buses, some people are driving through the parking lot as a short cut. Councillor Whitehead requested that a stop sign be erected at the end of the parking lot before they exit onto Westview Crescent.

(ii) Councillor Groves inquired as to the status of the OPP Contract Renewal and whether or not Staff knew when the Region of Peel would sign off on the Contract.

Director of Legal Services, Nadia Koltun, advised that the Contract had been forwarded to the Region of Peel and it is anticipated that it will be signed either tomorrow or the day after.

(iii) Councillor Groves referred to an article in the Toronto Star and the Caledon Enterprise regarding the Equestrian Park in Palgrave and the Equestrian Management Group. Councillor Groves noted that she recalled Council passing a resolution in late 2009 or early 2010 that requested Staff to report back to Council in 2010 regarding funding our portion of the 2015 Pan Parapan American Games. Councillor Groves inquired about the status of this matter.

Doug Barnes, CAO, advised that there have been numerous discussions regarding financing and responsibilities of the four organizations (Region of Peel, EMG, TRCA and the Town). Delays relate to provincial and federal involvement of the actual Pan AM bid. Doug Barnes indicated that approximately two weeks ago work commenced with the Pan AM bid Secretariat to determine cash flow needs and other matters such as options on financing.

Councillor Groves indicated her understanding is that the cost is 11 Million dollars with the provincial contribution at 5.6 or 5.4 Million. Councillor Groves noted this is a substantial amount of money for the Town to fund without comments from EMG, Peel Region and the TRCA and indicated she was hoping

to have it dealt with by this Council. Councillor Groves advised she did not want to see the costs explode like the G8 and G20 summits.

Doug Barnes, CAO, advised that construction at the park will not commence until negotiations are finalized.

- The introduction of new retail uses was already considered in the Town's Commercial Policy Review, and was determined to not be desirable, and;
- The background information provided with the application does not provide adequate planning justification for the introduction of the proposed uses.

**14. PUBLIC QUESTION PERIOD**

1. Sherry Brioschi questioned Council as to Notices of Motion being presented during an election year. She inquired specifically about a Notice of Motion presented by Councillor Thompson waiving fees and securities regarding Spirit Tree Estate Cidery and Councillor Thompson's relationship with Spirit Tree Estate Cidery. Ms. Brioschi was concerned about an endorsement for Councillor Thompson in the Regional of a political nature.

2. Tracey White questioned Council as to how the fine system of the Motorcycle By-law will work.

Staff Sergeant Sweeney advised that there are two separate offences under the By-law. One which is at a point of idle and the other at 2000 rpm. There is discretion and leniency involved with the laying of all charges.

3. Fern Doria inquired if Motorcycle Riders would receive anything to demonstrate that their Motorcycle has passed the Motorcycle Noise level test.

Staff Sergeant Sweeney advised that the OPP do not currently issue anything however, if something was put into the by-law to be issued the OPP would do so.

4. Denise Wright inquired as to whether Motorcycle Riders will be ticketed during the testing period.

5. Sherry Brioschi inquired as to whether or not the Noise By-law will extend to the Bolton Tractor Pull. Other sources of noise need to be targeted and Council needs to fairly implement Noise By-laws.

6. Terry Fast directed a question to Staff Sergeant Sweeney inquiring as to when a Motorcycle Rider is stopped for testing, what is a reasonable amount of detainment until a noise measurement device is to arrive.

Sergeant Sweeney indicated that it would be within a reasonable period of time being 10 to 15 minutes.

7. Denise Steeves inquired as to why Council is not following the J2825 document from the United States. Ms. Steeves advised that both the United States and Canada do not allow the importation of Motorcycles that do not pass a "drive-by" noise test.

8. Denise Wright stated that even if all Motorcycles do not exceed 90dB, what will happen when there are a group of Motorcycles travelling through Belfountain.

Mayor Morrison advised that the residents of Belfountain are aware that this By-law will not keep Motorcycles out of Belfountain.

9. Christine Cooper inquired about eligible Candidate expenses during a campaign period specifically regarding donations to an organization.

Karen Landry, Town Clerk / Director of Administration, advised Ms. Cooper that she would forward the Candidates' Guide and information on the Compliance Audit Committee to her.

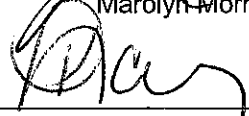
