Good morning,

In May 2009, the County of Dufferin initiated an Active Transportation and Trails Master Plan Study. This study consists of a network of both on and off-road trails that are designed to connect the urban and rural communities within Dufferin County and promote an active lifestyle. A copy of the draft Dufferin County Active Transportation and Trails (DCATT) Master Plan was presented to the Council of the County of Dufferin at its regular meeting of May 13, 2010, and circulated to local and adjacent municipalities, Ontario Ministry of Transportation and local school boards for comments.

AND THAT a digital copy of the revised draft Master Plan be issued to the local municipalities, adjacent municipalities, the Ontario Ministry of Transportation (Policy Branch and Design Branch), and local school boards.

Thank you for your letter regarding the GTA West Corridor Environmental Assessment (EA) Study. I appreciate the opportunity to respond to your comments.

The Ministry of Transportation initiated Stage 1 of the formal EA Study for the GTA West Corridor in January 2007 to support the transportation objectives of the provincial *Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe (2006)* by providing for the efficient movement of people and goods. The study is being undertaken as an Individual EA in accordance with the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act* and the GTA West Corridor Terms of Reference, which were approved by the Minister of the Environment on March 4, 2008.


I recognize the challenge to balance the need for planning for longer terms and the need to have reliable forecast information regarding growth patterns. It is particularly important to strike the right balance in order to make informed decisions when planning for major infrastructures. The planning horizon and the growth level in the GTA West Corridor Study are consistent with the *Growth Plan* which provides the growth targets and the associated growth management policies for the year 2031.

The Ministry of Transportation also recognizes the importance of the agricultural community and farming operations in the Town of Caledon. As you may be aware, a number of Caledon agricultural interests groups have been represented on the GTA West Study's Community Advisory Group (CAG), a group formed at the beginning of the study to provide valuable input on community perspectives. Representatives from Caledon on the CAG include local farmers and representatives for the Caledon Chamber of Commerce, Peel Federation of Agriculture, Caledon Environmental Advisory Committee, the Caledon Countryside Alliance and the Peel Soils and Crop Improvement Association. I can assure you that we will work closely with the farming communities in Caledon throughout the GTA West Study process and would welcome hearing any suggestions to better engage the Town in this regard.

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Thank you again for writing to me on this important matter. I am very encouraged by the Town of Caledon's continued interest in the GTA West Study.

THAT the Province of Ontario be requested to provide "intervener funding" to any municipalities affected by the appeal of any Growth Plan conformity, Official Plan amendment to the Ontario Municipal Board so as to enable the municipalities involved to defend their positions with respect to the Provincial Growth Plan conformity exercise before the Ontario Municipal Board without added cost to the Municipal Service and Delivery System and higher property taxes.
3. THAT a letter be sent by the Regional Chair along with this Resolution to the Premier of the Province of Ontario and the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing for their consideration and action in having the Province take the lead and the responsibility for the costs of any appeal proceedings before the Ontario Municipal Board on Growth Plan Conformity Official Plans by Regional and Local municipalities and by providing intervener funding to those municipalities who would be involved in any appeal proceedings respecting Growth Plan Conformity Exercises.

On June 28th, 2010 Town of Halton Hills Council passed Resolution No. 2010-0172 (attached) a significant resolution that will be circulated to every municipality in the Greater Golden Horseshoe, requesting that the Province of Ontario cover all appeal costs to the Ontario Municipal Board for Growth Plan Conformity Exercises.


The Provincial government's "Places to Grow Legislation" mandates that municipalities and the Regions meet certain growth objectives by 2031. For example Halton Region has conformed to the Province's Growth Plan approving growth to our population in Halton Region from 400,000 to 780,000. The financial impact to municipalities from the Places to Grow legislation has already been significant and the Ontario Municipal Board costs will be staggering as developers will be challenging municipalities and the Region on their decision to conform to the Provincial Legislation. These projected astronomical legal and consulting costs will be born by our present taxpayers based on this Provincial initiative.

ENBRIDGE GAS DISTRIBUTION INC. RATES FOR 2011

Enbridge Gas Distribution Inc. ("Enbridge") filed an Application on September 1, 2010 with the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") under section 36 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, S.O. c.15, Sched. B, as amended, for an order of the Board approving or fixing rates for the distribution, transmission and storage of natural gas, effective January 1, 2011. The Board's decision on this Application may have an effect on all of Enbridge's customers.

Enbridge has applied to the Board for new rates for 2011 to be set under the Incentive Regulation plan approved by the Board under File No. EB-2007-0615. 2011 will be the fourth year of the five year plan. The rates under the plan are adjusted each year by the application of a Distribution Revenue Requirement per Customer Formula (the "Adjustment Formula").

Enbridge has proposed a change to its delivery rates which, if approved by the Board, would result in an average rate increase of about 1.0% or less for all customer classes on a T-service basis (that is, excluding commodity costs). For residential customers, the average T-service increase will be about 1.0%, or about \$6 annually. Enbridge has also requested the continuation of deferral and variance accounts for 2011.

The Applicant indicated that it would file the evidence in support of the Application by October 1, 2010.

This proceeding will not deal directly with the commodity cost of natural gas. Any changes to the commodity cost of natural gas for customers that purchase gas directly from Enbridge are addressed through the Quarterly Rate Adjustment Mechanism. Copies of the Application are available for inspection at the Board's office and Enbridge's office at the addresses listed below.

Enbridge hereby applies to the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board"), pursuant to section 36 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, as amended (the "Act") for an Order or Orders approving or fixing just and reasonable rates for the sale, distribution, transmission and storage of gas commencing January 1, 2011.
3. As of January 1, 2011, Enbridge will be entering the fourth year of a five year Incentive Regulation plan approved by the Board in EB-2007-0615. The Board-approved Settlement Agreement in EB-2007-0615 (the "Settlement Agreement") establishes a revenue per customer cap framework for Enbridge's rates over the period from 2008 to 2012. Specifically, the Settlement Agreement provides that the Company's distribution revenue, in each year of the period January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2012 shall be determined by the application of a Distribution Revenue Requirement Per Customer Formula (the "Adjustment Formula").
4. Enbridge applies to the Board for such final, interim or other Orders, accounting orders and deferral and variance accounts as may be necessary in relation to:

- i. the application of the Adjustment Formula for the year commencing January 1, 2011; and
 - ii. the continuation of deferral and variance accounts for 2011 and the determination of all other issues that bear upon the Board's approval or fixing of just and reasonable rates for the sale, distribution, transmission and storage of gas by Enbridge for the year commencing January 1, 2011.
5. Enbridge further applies to the Board pursuant to the provisions of the Act and the Board's Rules of Practice and Procedure for such final, interim or other Orders and directions as may be appropriate in relation to the Application and the proper conduct of this proceeding.
6. As a result of this Application, average rate increases will be approximately 1.0% or less for all customer classes on a T-service basis (that is, excluding commodity costs). For residential customers, the average T-service increase will be approximately 1.0% or about \$6 annually. As required by the Settlement Agreement, Enbridge's filing in support of the Application will include detailed evidence explaining the rate changes.
7. In its Decision and Order in Phase 2 of Enbridge's 2009 Rate Adjustment Application (EB-2008-0219), the Board approved a timeline for Enbridge's rate adjustment process to allow for rates to be in place on January 1st of the year of the rate adjustment. The timeline calls for Enbridge to file its Application by September 1st of the year preceding the year of the rate adjustment, the Board to issue its Notice of Application shortly thereafter, and Enbridge to file its supporting evidence by October 1st.

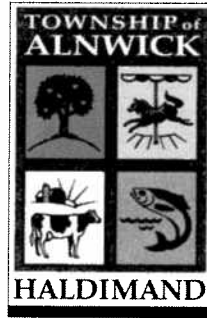
