Caledon Constructs Three Ground-mounted Solar Projects

The Town of Caledon is joining the many Caledon residents and businesses that are generating clean renewable energy for a green future.

Caledon will be responsible for the generation of 30 kW of solar electricity. Generating this much clean electricity is equivalent to taking 21 cars off the road or preserving 90 acres of forest.

“Not since the days of the Cataract Electric Company has so much renewable electricity been produced within Caledon,” noted Mayor Marolyn Morrison. “This initiative is both fiscally lucrative and environmentally responsible. We are doing our part in creating sustainable and renewable electricity while reducing our dependence on carbon-based fuels.”

In total, the Town has three ground-mounted solar projects: one located at the Caledon Village fire station, one at the Inglewood Community Centre, and the third at the Victoria Parks Community Centre. Electricity generated through these projects will be sold back to the province through the Feed-in Tariff Program. The revenue generated through this program will be re-invested into other Town energy conservation programs.
